

6TH MARINE CORPS DISTRICT COMMANDING OFFICER'S POLICY STATEMENT ON THE UNIT, PERSONAL, AND FAMILY READINESS PROGRAM

The Marine Corps values the contributions families make to our mission. If you are a Marine, a Civilian Marine, or the spouse, dependent, extended family member, or fiancée of a Marine, you are a part of our family. Support and resources are available even if you are not near a military installation.



Taking care of our families is a shared responsibility. It begins with the individual Marine. Our leaders are the next level of support. Official programs are the third level. These programs support and enable Marines, families, and leaders.

The 6th Marine Corps District's Unit, Personal, and Family Readiness Program (UPFRP) exists to support families by providing the knowledge, skills, and resources needed to thrive. The District Readiness Coordinator (DRC) is a special staff member based at the headquarters who oversees the UPFRP. Additionally, each Recruiting Station maintains its own UPFRP and has a Uniformed Readiness Coordinator (URC) appointed to assist Marines in caring for their families. Family Readiness Command Team Advisors may also be appointed to advise leaders and support the UPFRP.
